Geometry

Properties of shapes - draw 2D shapes using given dimensions and angles. Compare and classify geometric shapes based on their properties and sizes and find unknown angles in any triangles, quadrilaterals and regular polygons. Recognise angles where they meet at a point, are on a straight line, or are vertically opposite, and find missing angles.

Geometry

Position and direction -describe positions on the full coordinate grid (all four quadrants). Draw and translate simple shapes on the coordinate plane, and reflect them in the axes.



Year 6 Summer Term

Using a variety of sentence openers and sentence structures to add detail and interest.

Reading – stories, raps, explanation texts and discussion texts, focusing on comprehension skills. Opportunities to ask and answer questions about familiar texts.

Speaking & Listening – Talk partners, reading/presenting formally to a large audience using different media forms and class discussions. Being a member of a team and leading a team successfully.
