

John Bunyan Primary School Home School Agreement (revised with input from children July 2018)

As a school we will:

- Help your child follow the Code of Conduct enabling them to enjoy and give their best at all times.
- Provide a safe, secure and happy learning environment.
- Provide your child with a high standard of education and a broad balanced curriculum.
- Celebrate your child's academic and personal achievements.
- Care for your child's safety and well-being by observing and listening to them.
- Teach your child to develop a positive attitude to others, regardless of gender, race, culture, belief, values, age and need.
- Encourage your child to become an active member within our community and help them to see that they can have an impact on the world around them.
- Regularly meet with you to communicate the progress of your child, celebrating their strengths and explaining how we can support them in their areas for development.
- Provide information to you about our school, including relevant policies, meetings, workshops, activities, newsletters and open days.
- Set achievable homework/ reading to extend the curriculum and provide the opportunity for independent learning.
- Provide information and helpful training sessions for you that will give you confidence to support your child.
- Contact parents if there is a problem with attendance, punctuality or if there is any concerns about their child's work or behaviour.

As parents/carers/guardians we will:

- Encourage our child to; Be fair, Be caring, Be respectful and Make great choices,
- Make sure that our child arrives at school on time.
- Make sure that our child is wearing named school uniform and that their PE kit is in school at the beginning of each week.
- Telephone the school on the first day of absence and explain why our child is unable to attend
- Let the school know of any concerns or worries that may be affecting our child's learning, behaviour or ability to do homework, as this can then be resolved quickly.
- Support the school by encouraging our child to develop a positive attitude towards our diverse, multi-cultural community.
- Attend meetings with our child's teacher and other staff, aiming to be positive and productive, working towards moving our child on in their learning.
- Support the school's policies and its guidelines for behaviour and online safety (eSafety)
- Encourage a positive attitude towards our child's education and our school. If we have any concerns, we will come and discuss them with you to work out solutions.
- Read all information sent home as this gives us important details of relevant policies, meetings, workshops, activities, newsletters and open days.
- Support the school by making sure that reading and homework tasks are completed. A child who hasn't completed their reading/ homework is often an unhappy, worried one!

As a learner I will:

- Learn the Code of Conduct and try to Be fair, Be caring, Be respectful and Make great choices,
- Respect other children's culture, race, feelings, beliefs and values and understand that everyone is special.
- Accept responsibility for the things that I do and recognise that it's ok to make mistakes and we can learn from them.
- Abide by our class and school rules.
- Believe in myself, ask for help if I need it and try my best in all that I do.
- Take good care of our school building, equipment, school grounds and most importantly each member of our school community.
- Tell a member of staff if I am worried or unhappy.
- Read regularly at home and complete homework tasks set.
