A message for Year 2 Parents

From the Autumn term your child will no longer qualify to receive a free school meal as part of the Government's initiative for Reception, Year 1 & Year 2 pupils. If your child is eligible to receive free school meals (if you are in receipt of a qualifying benefit), then your child's meal will continue to be free. If you think you could be eligible for free school meals then please contact Mrs Pickard or check www.gov.uk/apply-free-school-meals

If you are not in receipt of free school meals a charge of £2.00 per meal will be charged. This must be paid in advance or on the day via ParentPay. If you have not activated your account please contact the school office.

- carry out some maintenance on the school's bug hotels in order to encourage wildlife onto the site;
- ensure that any further planting of trees on the field provides shade for children;
- organise a weekly rota for watering of plants in the greenhouse.

The team continue to collect crisps packets in the Key Stage 2 Hall and intend to extend this into the Key Stage 1 Hall this term. This initiative helps us collect points to spend on equipment for the school. Our next meeting is scheduled for Wednesday 3rd July.
