Crossing Patrol: Coldnailhurst Avenue

We have been asked by Essex County Council to remind parents and pupils to use the School Crossing Patrol on Coldnailhurst Avenue safely. There have been reports of people crossing the road behind the Patrol, where she cannot see them. This is dangerous as it is not immediately clear to the Patrol and drivers that the pedestrians walking behind are actually crossing. Thank you.

Attendance Matters

Attending school is essential for students to make good progress, achieve their academic potential and consequently have better life chances.

Every student is expected by the **Government** to maintain at least 96.1% attendance. Below are examples of how attendance impacts on learning over a year and five year period:

One year:

98% - approximately 4 days absent.

95% - approximately 10 days absent.

90% - approximately 4 weeks absent.

85% - approximately 5 ½ weeks absent.

80% - approximately 7 1/2 weeks absent

Over a five year period:

85-90% is similar to half a year off school.

80% is similar to having a whole year off school

Please inform the school if your child will be absent or late for any reason (01376 321814).

Holidays and absence in Term Time

It is the position of the Local Authority that pupils should not be granted leave of absence in term time unless for an **exceptional reason**. To comply with the attendance regulations parents MUST please complete an absence request form for any time that they are planning to take their child out of school, even if they know that it will be unauthorised. It is the directive of the Local Authority that if a parent decides to take their child out of school for **5 days or more** that they will incur a Penalty Notice of £60 per parent per child. This money does not go to the school but to the Local Authority.

Lateness

Since September, the number of late arrivals at school has been increasing. Obviously occasional late arrival at school can be unavoidable, however, when lateness is more frequent the children concerned may become anxious and miss valuable teaching times. Lateness also causes disruption to the class and therefore we are asking for your co-operation to ensure that your child/children attend punctually in the future.

Foundation Stage and Lower School (Years R, 1, 2): Gates open 8.45 a.m. and registration closes 8.55 a.m. Middle and Upper School (Years 3, 4, 5, 6): Gates open 8.40 a.m. and registration closes 8.55 a.m.

Children arriving after 8.55 a.m. are required to come into the school via the school office with a parent/carer who must sign them in.
